

JONSMOD HISTORY

JONSMOD was originally formed out of a Joint Numerical 1970s research programme. The acronym was **Joint North Sea Modelling** Group. In 1981, Phil Dyke became chairman and the organisation had three aims:

1. To run a workshop on the latest modelling techniques for shallow seas every two years (biennially).
2. To keep costs to a minimum and therefore to encourage young researchers to present their work in a friendly, unthreatening atmosphere, but to an informed audience.
3. To publish a selection of the papers in an internationally refereed journal. Hence giving young researchers a foot on the ladder into a research career.

To be more general the acronym was changed late 1980s to mean **Joint Numerical Sea Modelling** Group and the topics became wider (ecosystem and sediment application) but remain focused on coastal seas and estuaries modelling.

The JONSMOD workshops are organised by a volunteer institute. So far, JONSMOD met in the UK, Norway, The Netherlands, Belgium, Germany, Denmark and France. Recently, a rolling chairmanship was created. Local organizers automatically become chairman for the period until the next workshop.

In 2012, the JONSMOD workshop is hosted by the laboratory of coastal environment at IFREMER/BREST.
