





Crisis Management Organization






Tasks of a policy team






Information needs

Strategical/political Decision Making Strategies

Intuitive

-Time, good ‘feeling’ of decision

Consultative

+Time, create understanding for decision by hearing the different perspectives

Consult different parties in policy coordination dilemma's

Directive

-Time, with uncertainty

Negotitative

+Time, understand different views/motives before making a decision

Negotiate different systems/strategies for synchronization of strategies
