1 Introduction

This document contains the Release Notes of Delft-FEWS version 2017.02.

This version contains a number of new features developed under the Delft-FEWS 2020 roadmaps for the Delft-FEWS client-server system, the Delft-FEWS PI Webservice and the Deltares Open Archive. Therefore this is a special version with more installation/upgrade steps than normal and this release comes with a high impact.

These Release Notes consists of different sections focusing on the Roadmap developments (for the individual components) and the regular (non-roadmap) features in the Delft-FEWS client server system, the Delft-FEWS PI Web service and Deltares Open Archive.

The lists containing all new features and solved bugs can be found in the appendices.

2 Delft-FEWS 2017.02: First release with Delft-FEWS 2020 roadmap features

This version of Delft-FEWS contains the first series of new features and improvements from the Delft-FEWS 2020 roadmaps aiming at:

- Automatically installable, scalable and cloud-ready Delft-FEWS server side ('roadmap backend')
- Simply installable, high performing, secure and robust web service ('roadmap pi web service')
- Open and seamless integrated archive solution ('roadmap open archive')

The overall goal of the Delft-FEWS 2020 to have all new features and improvements implemented in Delft-FEWS 2018.02, so a first batch is available in this release.

2.1 Requirements for installing Delft-FEWS 2017.02

For running Delft-FEWS 2017.02, the following system (software) requirements are relevant:

- Delft-FEWS Server side
 - Oracle 12c or higher
 - MS SQL Server 2012 or higher
 - PostgreSQL 9.6
- Delft-FEWS PI Webservice
 -
- Deltares Open Archive
 - Apache Tomcat 7

3 Delft-FEWS Client-Server system

3.1 Remarks: Roadmap backend features

The most important feature in this release is the removal of JMS component (JBOSS/ActiveMQ). A new, internal mechanism based on VJDBC has been introduced to replace the *function* of communicating between the Delft-FEWS components (OC-MC-AI-FSS-Central database) based on DDA (direct database access). As a consequence a lot of code in the Master Controller (MC), Admin Interface (AI), Operator Client (OC) and the (McProxy of the) Forecasting Shell Server (FSS) has been adjusted to work with this new way of communication between components.

Besides that the following new features have been implemented

- A (completely) new database scheme
- New Master Controller
- New Rolling Barrel mechanism
- New synchronisation mechanism which is similar for MC-MC and MC-OC synchronisation.
- Temporarily adjusted system status page of the Admin Interface
- Delft-FEWS 2017.02 database scripts for Oracle require at least Oracle 12c. Please contact Delft-FEWS support when using Oracle 11g or earlier.
- The old ArchiveExport module is obsolete and no longer supported.
- Operator Clients that in 2017.01 and earlier used to connect externally via a https connection via JMS, will now have to use VPN solution or ActiveDirectory or postpone their migration to a later version were we have added security options, e.g. Delft-FEWS 2018.01. Please contact Delft-FEWS support for more details.

3.2 Remarks: Regular features

A large number of new features have been added to Delft-FEWS 2017.02.

This version only and required: running the Database Initialization Tool

In order to 'populate' the new and required column (globalRowId) in the database supporting the new synchronization and rollingbarrel mechanisms, this tool should be run.

Here you can find the details with an explanation when and how to run this tool:. For future upgrades to 2018.01 and higher the consecutive database update scripts need to be run including this tool when doing the 2017.02 upgrade.

4 Delft-FEWS PI Web service

4.1 Remarks: Roadmap backend features

The most important features in this release with respect to the roadmap 'PI Web service' are:

- Single installation file for all web services
- No additional configuration for Tomcat needed
- One test page for all web services
- Tests scripts using the cURL examples
- PI SOAP and PI REST methods have been aligned
- URL change for PI REST service
- JSON Support

4.2 Remarks: Regular features

The most important regular feature requests are:

- Manual edits (within a certain time period) can be retrieved/requested through the PI Web service
- The PI Web service has been extended to upload modifiers

4.3 Latest build and other relevant requirements

The build package for the Delft-FEWS PI Web service is called: `fews-web-services-stable-201702-#XXXXX.zip` in which XXXXX is the build number. This package can be retrieved from the Deltares build server (internal Deltares only) and on request by clients. In this zip file the `FewsWebServices.war` is available containing all web services.

Other requirements are:

- Tomcat 7 or Tomcat 8
- Java Runtime Edition (JRE): recommendation to use the same as the Delft-FEWS OC (1.8_172)

5 Deltares Open Archive

5.1 Remarks: Roadmap backend features

The most important features in this release with respect to the roadmap 'Deltares Open Archive' are:

- Easy to install: configuration can be done by any configurator without archive knowledge
- Elastic Search catalogue can be at any configurable location
- Simplified Thredds installation
- Updated Documentation

5.2 Remarks: Regular features

The regular features in 2017.02 with respect to the Deltares Open Archive are:

- Archiving of 3D profile data (in NetCDF) possible
- Integration of the Open Archive with Delft-FEWS client-server system
 - Open Archive Status visible in System Monitor
 - Archived forecasts visible in Forecast Manager
- Verification of (meta)data for simulated datasets
- What-if scenario names can be archived as custom properties
- Filter/checkbox for retrieving 'forecastsOnly' added
- Creating a NetCDF (grid) file on-the-fly (based on bounding box and viewperiod) from the Open Archive.

5.3 Latest build and other relevant requirements

The build package for the Deltares Open Archive is called: `deltares-archive-stable-201702-#XXXXX.zip` in which XXXXX is the build number. This package can be retrieved from the Deltares build server (internal Deltares only) and on request by clients.

In this zip, amongst others the `deltares-archive-server.war` file can be found containing the archive tool. The Thredds installation and example configuration for both the Open Archive as well as Thredss are included.

Other requirements are:

- Tomcat 7 or Tomcat 8
- Java Runtime Edition (JRE): recommendation to use the same as the Delft-FEWS OC (1.8_172)
- Thredds
